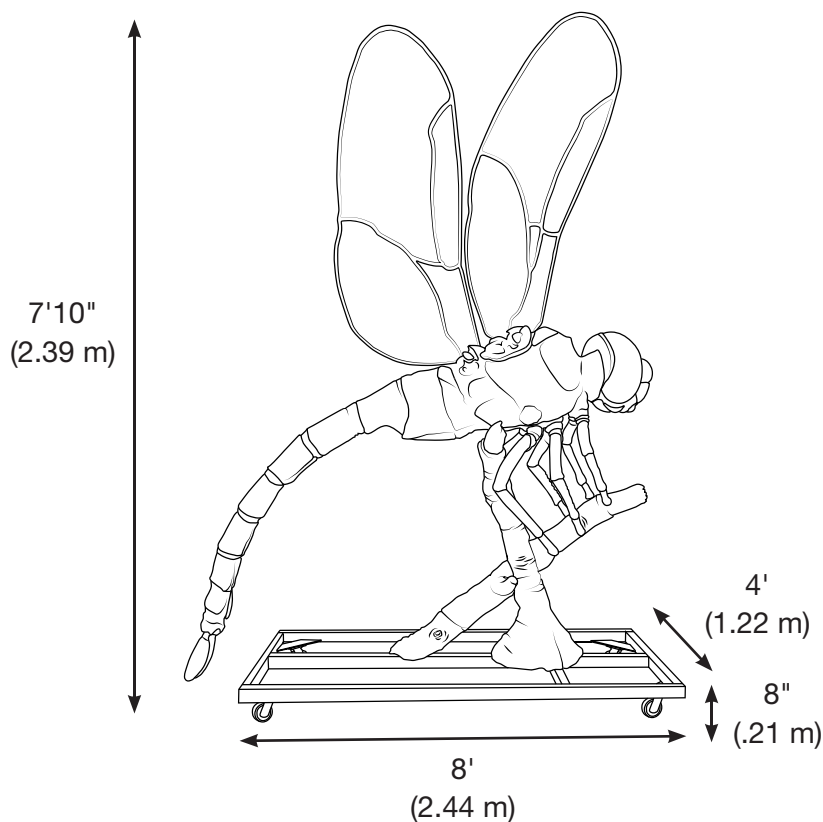


BLUE EYED DARNER



- Dragonflies may be nature's most effective hunter, with a 95% midair capture rate.
- The blue-eyed darner can be found in western North America and in Central America as far south as Panama, at both low and moderate altitudes.
- They live near a variety of water bodies, lakes, ponds, slow-moving streams, canals and marshy areas.
- Females lay eggs among dense water plants, on floating branches in open water, depositing the eggs both above and below the surface.
