
SEVEN SPOT LADYBIRD





- Seven-spotted ladybirds, or ladybugs are commonly red or orange with three spots on each side and one in the middle; they have a black head with white patches on each side.
- They're considered useful insects, because they prey on agricultural pests such as aphids or scale insects.
- A common myth is that the number of spots on the insect's back indicates its age; while the pattern and colouration are actually determined by the species and genetics of the beetle.
