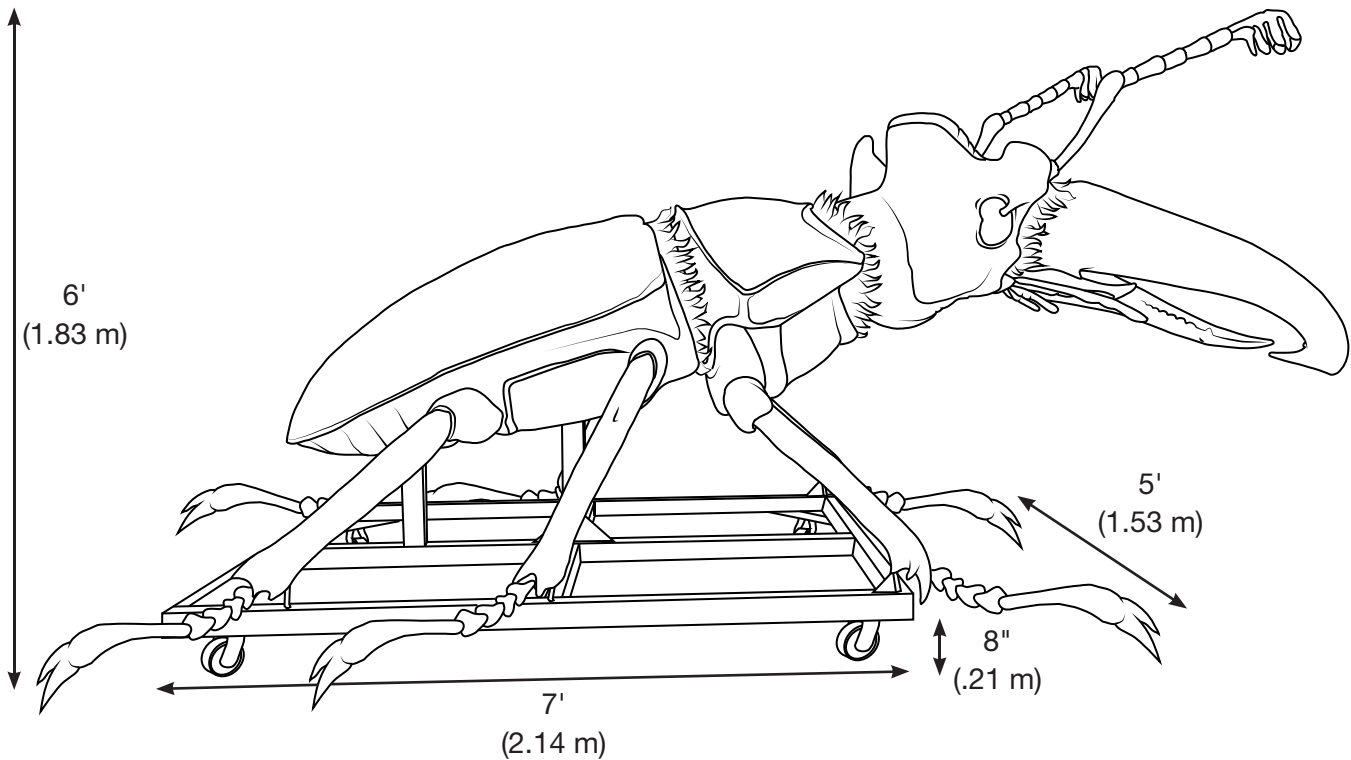


# STAG BEETLE



- Stag beetles use their large mandibles to fight off opponents, similar to a male deer, hence their name.
- Stag beetle larvae feed for several years on rotting deciduous wood, growing through three larval stages until pupating inside a pupal cell made from surrounding wood pieces and soil.
- Some species may grow as large as 4.7 inches long (over 12 cm), but most are about 2 inches long (5 cm).
- Female stag beetles are usually smaller than the males, with smaller mandibles. Though smaller, female mandibles are much more powerful than the males.
- Despite their often frightening appearance, stag beetles aren't aggressive to humans.
