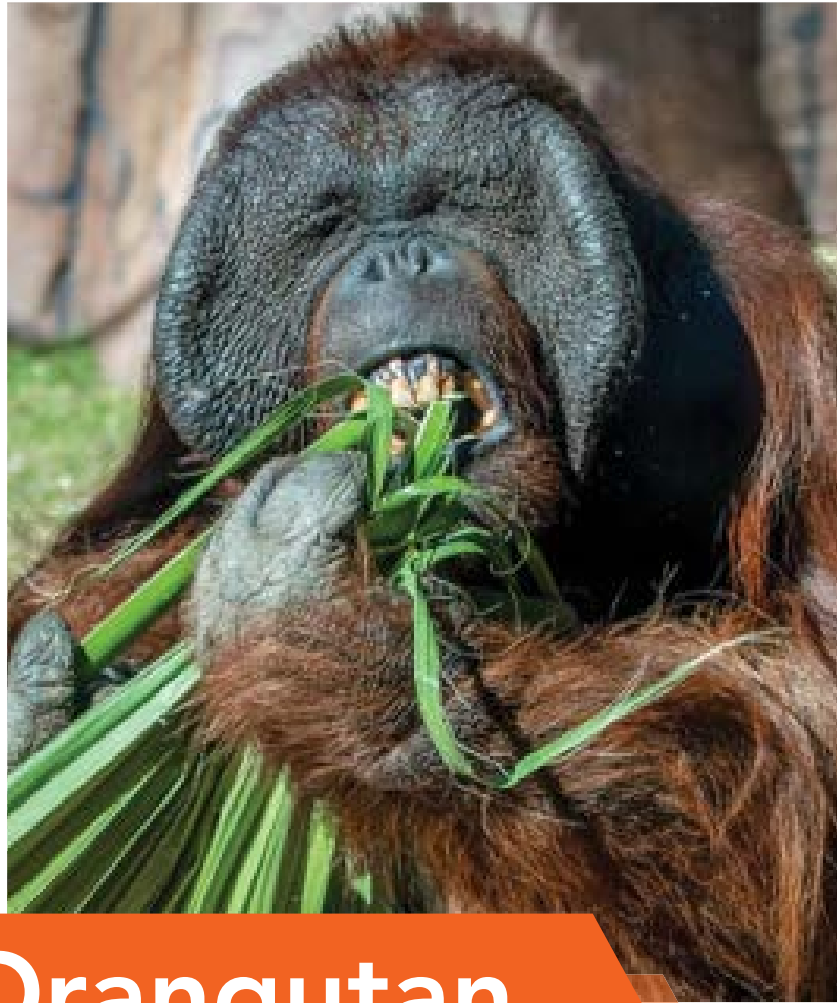

SPECIES OF ORANGUTANS:

There are 3 types of orangutans: Bornean, Sumatran, and Tapanuli orangutans. The orangutans at the Phoenix Zoo are Bornean orangutans.



HABITAT:

Bornean orangutans live on the island of Borneo, off the coast of Asia. Sumatran orangutans live on the island of Sumatra in Indonesia. Tapanuli orangutans live in the northern part of Sumatra only.

HEIGHT: Up to 54 inches or 4 1/2 feet

WEIGHT: Up to 191 lbs.

LIFE SPAN: Up to 35-40 years in the wild. Up to 59 years in zoos.

WHAT THEY EAT:

Orangutans eat lots of ripe fruits—up to 100 kinds. When fruits are scarce, they eat leaves, flowers, bark, honey, termites, ants (and other insects) and even bird eggs.


