

# It's (Good)

hey're cute. They're tiny. They're mighty little predators. And the Phoenix Zoo is helping them return to their native habitat here in Arizona. Meet the cactus ferruginous pygmy-owl!

These pygmy-owls used to live right here in the Phoenix region, nesting in saguaro cactus cavities. But their future in Arizona and beyond is in doubt due to habitat loss and fragmentation, as well as climate change. Biologists estimate that they number in the low hundreds in our state. ere at the Phoenix Zoo, we are working across departments to breed and care for pygmy-owls, and to help our conservation partners release them to the wild in southern Arizona. Through initial releases, we are testing methods that will help us refine our reintroduction strategies. This important work is done in collaboration with the US Fish and Wildlife Service, Arizona Game and Fish Department, Wild at Heart, US Geological Survey, and other conservation partners. In 2021, we celebrated the first release of pygmyowls hatched at the Zoo into the wild. Twentytwo owls from the Zoo were reintroduced to two locations in southern Arizona, and subsequently monitored by our conservation partners.

This year we had another successful pygmy-owl breeding season. All six of our owl pairs, including Pat and Porgie who are now exhibited in the Arizona Aviary, laid eggs and produced chicks this spring - for a total of 18 fledglings! We are excited for them to contribute to pygmy-owl recovery in our state.

#### LWHATEGAN EXCILEDIOR LOW HAT HAVE MY COWLS?

Just by coming to the Zoo, you are supporting our work to help the cactus ferruginous pygmy-owl! Your admission or membership fee helps fund our work to breed and care for these rare raptors. Also, do your part to combat climate change, from simple actions in your daily life to advocating for big-picture change to keep our state from a hotter, drier future.

#### Andean Bear Day (Bear Conservation Day)

he Forest of Uco on the Tropics Trail is home to many fascinating Latin American species including a charismatic two-year-old Andean bear nicknamed Auggie. His full name is Agapito, meaning "the beloved," and he is certainly that. Arriving at the Zoo in late 2021 from San Diego, Auggie has quickly become a guest favorite, posing for the camera as he chills in his favorite tree.

Auggie, like all Andean bears, is solitary by nature and arboreal. Using their long front legs and sharp claws, they climb trees to forage for food, sometimes building leafy platforms to nest. The only bear species found in South America, the Andean bear lives in forests, grasslands and scrublands feasting on fruits, grasses, small mammals and birds. Despite recent efforts to protect their habitats, the Andean bear is still considered a vulnerable species and is part of AZA's Saving Animals From Extinction (SAFE) program which focuses on targeted research, monitoring and capacity-building efforts. Shy and reclusive, they're difficult to find in the wild but you can see one right here at the Phoenix Zoo.

Next time you visit the Forest of Uco, say "hola" to Auggie and wish him happy Andean Bear Day on July 21!

#### More "bear-y" cool facts:

- They are sometime called spectacled bears due to the rings of light fur around their eyes.
- This bear species was the inspiration for Paddington Bear.
- The longest living Andean bear in managed care was over 38 years old and lived in the National Zoo in Washington D.C.
