Comics and Conservation Collide in the Phoenix Zoo's Newest Wild Side Gallery Art Exhibit

PHOENIX (August 11, 2025) - The Phoenix Zoo's Wild Side Gallery is thrilled to announce its next dynamic exhibit: Comic Conservation, opening September 4, 2025, and running through January 25, 2026. This one-of-a-kind exhibit fuses the colorful world of comic art with the inspiring mission of wildlife conservation.

Comic Conservation features original works from a diverse lineup of acclaimed comic artists from the Southwest and beyond. With a mix of superhero-themed pieces, animal-inspired illustrations and imaginative storytelling, this exhibit celebrates the natural world through the lens of pop culture.

The Zoo is also thrilled to include a special contribution from legendary comic book creator Todd McFarlane – creator of *Spawn*, co-creator of *Venom* and one of the most iconic *Spider-Man* artists of all time. A signed print by McFarlane will be on display in the Gallery as part of the exhibition.

"Their visual storytelling and pop culture appeal make them an engaging and effective way to bring conservation messaging to the masses in a fun, approachable way.
